

EVOLUTION VS. NUMBERS AND NAMES

“He counts the number of the stars; He calls them all by name” (Psalm 147:4). The number of stars God has names for is absolutely astounding. There are approximately 200 billion trillion stars in our observable universe. Or, to put it another way, 200 sextillion.
