

EXAMPLES OF TYPES (from Roy B. Zuck)

Melchizedek	Christ's heavenly priesthood	Hebrews 7:3, 15-17
Aaron	Christ's earthly ministry	Hebrews 5:4-5
Feast of Passover	Christ our sacrifice	I Corinthians 5:7
Feast of Unleavened Bread	A believer's holy walk	I Corinthians 5:7-8
Feast of Firstfruits	Christ's resurrection	I Corinthians 15:20-23
Feast of Pentecost	The coming of the Holy Spirit	Acts 2:1-47
Feast of Trumpets	Israel's regathering	Matthew 24:21-23
Feast of Atonement	Israel's national conversion	Romans 11:26-27
Feast of Tabernacles	Sufficiency of Jesus through the H.S.	John 7:2, 37-39
Sabbath	The Christian's spiritual rest	Hebrews 4:3, 9, 11
Tabernacle	The way to God	Hebrews 5;8;9:23
Tabernacle curtain	Christ the believer's access to God	Hebrews 10:20
Burnt offering	Total dedication of Christ as an offering	Hebrews 10:5-7
Fellowship offering	Christ the perfect sacrifice	Hebrews 10:8
Sin offering	Christ's atonement for sin	Hebrews 13:11-12
Guilt offering	Christ's atonement for sin	Hebrews 10:12

Only one of Israel's seven feasts, the Passover, is specifically mentioned as a type (I Corinthians 5:7), but Colossians 2:16-17 tells us that all Israel's feast days were "a shadow of things to come." Hebrews 9:9-10 suggests that all of Israel's sacrificial offerings were types.
