

PRAYING PSALM 125

“Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, which cannot be moved...” (Psalm 125:1).

Seven words convey the message of this psalm: 1. PERMANENCE (1). Those who trust in the Lord cannot be moved. 2. PROTECTION (2). The Lord surrounds His people. 3. PROMISE (3a). The scepter of wickedness shall not rest on the land allotted to the righteous. 4. PERIL (3b). Lest the righteous reach out their hands to iniquity. 5. PRAYER (4). Do good, O Lord, to those who are good. 6. PREDICTION (5a). The Lord will lead away those who persist in their crooked ways. 7. PEACE (5b). Peace be upon Israel.

Our greatest stability comes from trusting God’s permanence. He is immutable. He doesn’t change. Praying with that knowledge will stabilize your faith. Being assured that God surrounds you with the protections of His grace will bring courage to your faith. In the midst of chaos in Israel today, your faith can be buoyed by the future promises for that chosen nation. People who do not know the Word of God concerning Israel are at great peril of embracing error through ignorance. When you pray, ask for God’s goodness on those who are good. Ask God to remove the crooked-minded who hate Israel. Ask for peace in Israel and the salvation of the Jewish nation. And remember you are living in the last days when Christ will return for the church and regather Israel to their land for His kingdom reign.
