

PRAYING PSALM 45

“Your throne O God is forever and ever. A scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your kingdom” (Psalm 45:6).

Probably this psalm celebrated the marriage of King Solomon (1-5). In type it speaks of the marriage of the Lamb with His bride (the church) (6-7). It is quoted in Hebrews 1:8-9 when referring to the Son of God. In the psalm God the Father is speaking to Christ the King, whom He promises to make His name remembered in all generations (16-17).

Do as the psalm says, and praise Jesus forever (17). Then join John the Apostle and say, “Come Lord Jesus” (Revelation 22:21).
