

PRAYING PSALM 64

“The righteous shall be glad in the Lord, and trust in Him” (Psalm 64:10).

Once again David addresses God about the wicked. 1. THE PSALMIST’S COMPLAINT (1-6). David complained about: His fear of the enemy (1). The plots of the wicked against him (2-4). The talk of the wicked about him (5). The problem with their tongue, their thoughts, and their heart (5-6). 2. THE PSALMIST’S CONSOLATION (7-10). God will destroy them (7). God will make them stumble over their own tongue (8). At the end of this life they will go down to the lower parts of the earth (11).

Sometimes all you can do about the wicked is complain. Make sure you file your complaints with God. The wicked talk the way they do, think the way they do, and act the way they do because their hearts are corrupt. The wicked have no desire to change. They care nothing for salvation. They thrive on disrupting and disturbing the righteous. The wicked are your enemy, because they are God’s enemy. Complain about them to God. Commit them to God, and live in the consolation that they will be judged by God. That is how you as a righteous person can be glad in the Lord, despite the wicked.
