REVELATION 1

- 1. What is the Book of Revelation? (1)
 - A revelation (vision) of JC
- 2. Why was Revelation written? (1)
 - To show ... things that must shortly (quickly) come to pass
- 3. Who wrote it? (1-2)
 - It was given to John by an angel, who received it from JC, who received it from the Father
 - A testimony of the vision <u>John</u> saw of JC
- 4. Why study it? (3)
 - A blessing promised for: reading, hearing, keeping
- 5. To whom was Revelation written?
 - To 7 churches in Asia Minor (4, 11)
- 6. What is the vision? (A VISION OF CHRIST GLORIFIED) (12-18)
 - 7 golden candlesticks = 7 churches
 - Jesus as a priest & judge
 - 7 stars in His right hand = angels (messengers)
 - Out of His mouth a two-edged sword
 - His countenance was like the sun
 - Revelation (Apocalypse) = a symbolic forecast of the final judgments of God
- 7. What was John to do w/ the vision?
 - Write the symbolic forecast of the final judgments of God
 - Send the symbolic forecast of these judgments to the 7 churches
- 8. What John was commanded to write is the outline of Revelation

The outline is the key to understanding Revelation

- Write the things you have seen (chapter 1)
- And the things which are (chapters 2-3)
- And the things which will be hereafter (chapters 4-22)

REVELATION 2-3

1. EPHESUS (2:1-7)

- Christ commended them for their works & doctrinal purity. They had lost their 1st love
- 2. SMYRNA (2:8-11)
 - They refused to worship Caesar. They were persecuted. Some were martyred
- 3. PERGAMOS (12-17)
 - They held fast to Christ & did not deny the faith. They compromised their doctrine. The Doctrine of Balaam = doctrine of compromise. The doctrine of the Nicolaitans (Gr. Nicolaos = victor of people) = establishment of priests over the people.
- 4. THYATIRA (18-29)
 - They had faith and good works, but had a woman pastor named Jezebel who seduced the church to spiritual unfaithfulness
- 5. SARDIS (3:1-6)
 - This church had no spiritual power. Very few were saved
- 6. PHILADELPHIA (7-13)
 - This was a revival church. Christ set before them an open door (7).
 - Christ will keep them from the hour of temptation which shall come upon the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth (10)
- 7. LAODICEA (14-22)
 - This church was lukewarm (tepid, warm). They refused to take a stand for Christ. Jesus was on the outside, knocking to get in (20)
 - Jesus said, I will vomit you out of my mouth (16)

WHAT DOES THIS HAVE TO DO W/ TODAY?

- 1. What Jesus saw in the church then is what He sees no
- 2. This is a picture of Christ's judgment of the church today
 - EPHESUS = loveless church
 - SMYRNA = persecuted church
 - PERGAMOS = compromising church
 - THYATIRA = corrupt church
 - SARDIS = dead church
 - PHILADELPHIA = faithful church
 - LAODICEA = Christless church

- 3. The church age was a mystery (20)
 - The church is a mystery (Ephesians 3:3, 4, 9)
 - In the church age there is good & bad
 - Christ will separate the good & the bad at the Rapture
- 4. The Parables of the Kingdom are *mysteries* of the Kingdom
 - PARABLE OF THE SOWER 4 types of soil good & bad
 - WHEAT & TARES error will grow alongside the truth
 - THE MUSTARD SEED evil will become a large tree birds are in it (evil)
 - LEAVEN evil will spread rapidly
 - HIDDEN TREASURE = Israel hidden in a field will be purchased by Christ
 - PEARL OF GREAT PRICE = Church is a valuable pearl purchased by Christ
 - DRAGNET at the end of the age the wicked will be separated from the just

CONCLUSION

- 1. Christ is walking through the candlesticks (churches), evaluating the good & bad
- 2. Good & bad is determined by obedience to the Word of God
- 3. Good & bad in churches is largely determined by the messengers (angels)
- 4. The rapture will separate the good from the bad
- 5. The Tribulation is a judgment of the bad
